Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.


The People remain standing. Silence is kept.

The People sit


Light one candle for hope, One bright candle for hope. He brings hope to everyone, He comes, He comes.

Light one candle for love, One bright candle for love. He brings love to everyone, He comes, He comes.


The Great Thanksgiving

Adult Education. At 10 a.m. today, the Reverend Dr. Julie Faith Parker, our guest teacher, concludes her three-session sequence entitled "Three Women and a Little Baby: Advent and Luke 1-2."
