The boy choristers, through their daily work and engagement in the musical ministry of the Church, are essential to the Church's Mission: To worship, love and serve Our Lord Jesus Christ through the Anglican tradition and its unique choral heritage.

To ensure the high standards of your predecessors, the School shall maintain accreditation by the New York State Association of Independent Schools or other recognized independent school accrediting body.

Christopher, will you do all in your power to promote and support this vision?

Christopher responds: By God's help, I will.

Christopher, do you, in the presence of this parish and school community, commit yourself to this new trust and responsibility?

Christopher responds: I do.

He then adds this blessing




