2022 YEAR IN REVIEW

The Year in Review

Introduction

I vowed to myself that I would not begin my introduction to the 2022 Year Book with any mention of the word pandemic and yet, three years since the first cases in China, the pandemic is not over and we are still struggling with new variants, new waves, and for those testing positive, a fresh period of self-isolation. Regular use of masks and hand-sanitizing has now become the norm and I wonder if we will ever move away from them. One of the scientific breakthroughs of 2022 was the ability to fine tune the vaccine to respond to the very infectious Omicron variant. Even having had more than one booster, people were still contracting the virus, though it no longer seems deadly to much of the vaccinated population. If you are reading this many years into the future, you may be amazed to read this is three years after the first cases of COVID were reported. As if Coronavirus was not enough, 2022 saw a sudden outbreak of monkeypox around the world but, even more worrying, an exponential rise in influenza as the winter set in, and in Europe, intensive care beds once again became scarce with elderly and immunocompromised people now affected by a strong strain of the flu.

Nevertheless, Saint Thomas began the year in good heart, and on-line numbers of worshippers continued to strengthen. One fascinating fact is that in December, 2021, 28,000 people joined us on-line for worship. In December, 2022, that number had risen to 38,000. More important still is the fact that the average viewing time for those 38,000 was 25 minutes. If someone had said to me in 2014 that, in addition to our in-person worshippers, we would have 38,000 visitors each spending 25 minutes in church, I would have found it hard to believe.

During 2022, we resumed more in-person gatherings, and the Pilgrims' class resumed in hybrid form. One of the unexpected positive things to have come out of the pandemic is the improvement in our on-line facilities. Following the success of Project Gabriel (our 11-camera livestream system) in the Church, and our hard-working communications team led by Mr. Blake Martin, both Sunday School and Adult Education were able to offer hybrid gatherings with people joining via zoom and in-person simultaneously. The Vestry and other committees made the decision to always offer hybrid meetings. Years ago, that was frowned upon – now it has become a way of life. That being said, I think it is still preferable for us to gather in-person whenever possible as one cannot truly 'read the room' or, indeed, people's faces when there are multiple faces on a flat screen.

A highlight of 2022 was the resumption of a fuller liturgical expression of our life together; processions through and around the church resumed after a two-year hiatus, and we had the first full observance of Holy Week for the first time since 2019. Nevertheless, the Omicron variant and a large number of infections meant that we were still careful about masking and social-distancing. Similarly, Concerts at Saint Thomas continued and enjoyed greater in-person participation. Although the restrictions placed on the Choir School lessened in 2022, it was still challenging for the choir to fully function as it had before the pandemic.

On the world's stage, the Russian invasion of Ukraine caused dismay and distress as thousands of people were displaced. The indiscriminate targeting of civilians and civilian infrastructure caused moral outrage all over the world, but by the end of the year, the Ukrainians had surprised most military and political commentators in the defense of their land. As we prepare to begin 2023, our hope is that common sense will prevail, and that some kind of peace can be found.

In May, Queen Elizabeth II celebrated a milestone in the history of world monarchies by celebrating her Platinum Jubilee; she was not only the world's oldest head of state, she was also the longest reigning monarch ever. The outpouring of joy in the Commonwealth of Nations was followed by an outpouring of deep sadness when Queen Elizabeth died four months later at the age of 96, a matter of days after appointing her fifteenth Prime Minister. A special service was held to commemorate her death, attracting over 15,000 online viewers, and it was the first time since the Pandemic began that large numbers of Ambassadors, Consul Generals, their staff and staff of the United Nations attended in-person services at Saint Thomas. Books of Remembrance were available in Church from her

death until the funeral, and long queues formed as people paid their respects.

In 2022 many countries began to fear an economic recession and people all over the world saw the cost of living rise along with interest rates. With the careful support of J.P. Morgan and our hard-working Investment Committee, we were pleased to have beaten our bench marks in spite of uncertainty in the markets.

However, in the United States, mass shootings became ever more common with 641 occurring during the year. On May 24, at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas, 19 children and two teachers were murdered and a further 17 others wounded. We placed the portraits of the children and the two teachers on the candle stand next to the Shrine of Our Lady of Fifth Avenue.

The Choir School Board of Trustees completed its first academic year and the Trustees were present at the Choir School Graduation for the first time.

The Pilgrims' Class started again in January with fifteen regular attendees in-person and ten on-line.

The Vestry introduced a new process by which exiting members of the Vestry met with the Rector and Wardens to share thoughts about their time on the Vestry, and advice for the future.

In February, a number of staff attended the Annual CEEP (Consortium of Endowed Episcopal Parishes) Conference in Atlanta. This was the first in-person conference since 2020. The Rector took part in a key-note conversation with the Most Reverend Hosam Naoum, Archbishop of Jerusalem.

In March, the Rector attended the first Leadership Retreat for the Venerable Order of Saint John, held in Los Angeles. He was elected to the Chapter of the American Priory and, later in the year, appointed Co-Chair of the New York Region. While he was in California, he preached at St. John's Cathedral, LA.

Holy Week saw a much-improved attendance in-person and we were delighted to have the larger-than-life former Archbishop of York, John Sentamu, as the visiting preacher. Sentamu preached seven sermons on the theme of 'living a Jesus Christ-shaped life' and, on Easter day to a packed church, had the whole congregation using their bodies to show how much Jesus loved them. The Three Hours' Devotion was preached by the Holy Week conductor of 2021, The Rev. Professor Katherine Grieb. Both preachers were well-received.

Immediately after Easter, the long-awaited and thrice postponed Parish Pilgrimage to the Holy Land finally took place. With our partners from the Living Church Foundation, we were a small group of 22, half of which were from Saint Thomas Church. Although this was smaller than the original planned group of pilgrims, it led to an extremely intimate and life-changing experience. With our knowledgeable Palestinian-Coptic guide, our very full program took us all over Galilee, to Jericho, Bethlehem, and Jerusalem. From Caesarea Philippi to Magdala, the scriptures were opened by the Bishop of Tennessee, and the Rector looked after the liturgies each day. We were warmly welcomed by the keepers of so many of the Holy Land's holy sites, and were privileged to be able to say Mass each day in quite different places – from the Episcopal Church in Nazareth to the Mount of the Beatitudes; from the Chapel of St. Peter in Gallicantu (where Peter denied Jesus three times) to St. George's Cathedral – the pilgrimage was extremely moving. Celebrating Mass in a Palestinian School in Jericho run by Franciscans was heart-breaking because of the poverty we saw, but we also saw great faith and cooperation between Jew, Muslim, and Christian. The wall surrounding Bethlehem was shocking, but waiting for two hours to see the Grotto in the Church of the Holy Nativity with a large group of Ethiopian Pilgrims was inspirational. Saying Mass in the Shepherd's Field cave and taking a fishing boat across Lake Galilee brought the Gospels to life and we all left changed, and grateful. The Pilgrimage coincided with the end of Passover, the end of Ramadan, and the Orthodox Easter Celebrations, so security as well as tensions in Jerusalem were high. Exploring the Temple Mount brought the psalms alive and the Rector spotted swallows still living in the ancient walls of the Temple complex: "Yea, the sparrow hath found her an house, and the swallow a nest where she may lay her young: even thy altars, O Lord of hosts, my King and my God." (Psalm 84). Particularly breathtaking was traveling to the Damascus Gate at midnight to see the amazing Palestinian market. While on pilgrimage, the members of the group who were members of the Order of St. John visited the Eye Hospital in Jerusalem and were warmly welcomed with a tour and meeting with the Chief Executive, Dr. Ahmad Ma'ali. We asked Dr. Ma'ali if there was anything specific that the hospital needed and we learned that their OCT machine (optical coherence tomography) was about to fail. An OCT

machine captures high quality images of the retina, and so we took this to the Grants Committee and were delighted that Saint Thomas decided to buy a new machine for the hospital.

On return, the Bishop of London visited to give the talk to the annual Church Club gathering. Bishop Mullaly then preached at Saint Thomas on the Sunday.

The Choirmasters' Conference resumed in-person and internationally renowned organist and pedagogue Todd Wilson was featured as the 2022 guest clinician, celebrating the legacy of Saint Thomas Church's former Organist and Master of the Choristers Gerre Hancock in the conference's opening recital and keynote lecture.

The Rector and one or two parishioners were invited by Archbishop Caccia, the Permanent Representative of the Holy See to the United Nations, to attend the Pathway to Peace Gala at which the King and Queen of Jordan were honored. King Abdullah spoke powerfully and movingly about the road to peace and how hard that road was in the Middle East. He also spoke of the role of the Sacred Sites of the three Abrahamic Religions, and those of us who had recently been on pilgrimage were heartened.

At the beginning of June, the Rector was invited by the Sub Dean of the Chapel Royal to join the Royal Household for Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee celebrations. They sat in a grandstand to watch the Trooping of the Color, and then attended a special luncheon. The Rector attended a dinner for the 1660 Society that celebrates the restoration of Anglican liturgy and music to the Chapel Royal with the restoration of the monarchy under Charles II. On the Sunday, Canon Turner preached at a special Evensong to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee in the Chapel Royal of St. James's palace, Westminster.

During the early summer, interviews were held for the post of Head Verger and Theologian in Residence. During his annual leave over the summer, the Rector and Mother Turner visited Fra. John Dunlap, who had recently been appointed Lieutenant of the Grand Master in the Sovereign Order of Malta in Rome. They were given a tour of the Palace, and the Order's Church and Villa.

In September, the Dean of Westminster had to cut short his first ever visit because of the death of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

A special Evensong was also held to celebrate the life of Martha Dodge, followed by a gathering at the University Club.

Mr. Benjamin Sheen made his first visit back to Saint Thomas since becoming Sub Organist of Christ Church, Oxford, and gave a splendid organ recital to coincide with the release of his first organ CD recorded on the Miller-Scott Organ.

In September, we welcomed a Seminarian on placement from St. Stephen's House, Oxford. Ms. Josie Godfrey spent a month shadowing Fr. Schultz, and engaging in pastoral care and children and family activities, and being fully immersed in the liturgical life of the parish.

In October, the choristers had their first tour since the pandemic! A very successful few days was held in the Midwest with concerts in Madison and Chicago. The Rector went in advance and had meetings at Nashotah House Theological Seminary. On the Sunday, the boys sang in a Trebles Festival in St. James' Cathedral and the Rector preached.

On St. Edward the Confessor's Feast Day which is also the Feast Day of Blessed Gerard – one of the saints of the Order of Malta and the other Johannine Orders – the Rector was invited with members of the parish who are also members of the Order of St. John to attend a joint service of Vespers at St. Vincent Ferrer Church in the New York.

A special event was held at the Rectory to honor Deacon Acella Lee from the Anglican Church of Korea. Members of EAST (Episcopal Asian Supper Table) attended and Bishop Shin and Deacon Acella each gave a talk,

The Annual Investiture of the Order of St. John was held in Houston, Texas, and a number of parishioners attended.

The October concert saw not one, but two world premieres and two pianos used in a concert, probably for the first time at Saint Thomas.

At All Saintstide, the Dean of St. Patrick's Cathedral, Dublin, Ireland, visited and preached at Saint Thomas. A reception was held at the Rectory for parishioners with Irish ancestry, and some local clergy of Irish descent, and members of the Irish Center in Brooklyn, also attended. It was a very happy event.

The first Young Adult gathering since the pandemic started was held at the Rectory on November 4 and very well attended, not least because the Young Adult Group accidentally sent the invitation to the Diocesan group! It was rather like the feeding of the 5000! But it went down well and re-energized the group.

Another first was the Senior Lunch held on November 9 – these had been hugely missed by our senior members throughout the past three years of pandemic. It was good to entertain our most loyal and faithful members once again.

Thanksgiving felt a little more familiar this year, and was quickly followed by a splendid Advent Procession with some beautiful music. Also, on Advent Sunday, we welcomed the Reverend Dr. Luigi Gioia as our new Theologian in Residence. Of international renown, and a former Roman Catholic Benedictine whose last teaching position was at St. Anselmo's Pontifical University in Rome, Fr. Gioia immediately won the hearts of parishioners with his quiet and scholarly approach to teaching, and his beautiful preaching, singing, and liturgical presence. We welcomed his husband, Claudio, and wished them both well as they began a new life 'across the pond.'

On December 3, the Diocese held an election for a Bishop Coadjutor to succeed Bishop Dietsche who had announced his intention to retire in 2024. Friend of the parish and local parish priest, The Reverend Matt Heyd, Rector of Heavenly Rest, was elected.

December saw a resumption of concerts and social events. Sadly, the Rector contracted COVID just before the second Messiah concert and the much-awaited Parish Guild Party had to be quickly moved from the Rectory to Andrew Hall. The same was true of the Midtown Clericus Christmas party.

A splendid Christmas Party was held for the Sunday School and the Noble Singers after the Crèche Service; held in the parish House, there was hardly any room to move!

Because of the success of the special Evensong to mark the death of Queen Elizabeth, a number of Ambassadors and Consul Generals asked if there could be a special Carol Service. On Tuesday, December 20, the shorter service of Lessons and Carols was followed by a reception in Andrew Hall attended by around 100 diplomatic service members from the Commonwealth of Nations.

The Year came to a close with very large congregations for Christmas and, as mentioned earlier, a significant increase in on-line attendance.

WORSHIP NOTES

2022 saw a more regular pattern of weekday worship. The daily Shrine Prayers continued to be very important, particular to on-line members of the congregation, and requests for prayers came in via the website daily. People were able to request candles to be lit in church for an intention and eight-day candles could be purchased to which we affixed the name(s) or prayer request. The daily Mass after Shrine Prayers continued to be the mainstay of our weekday worship. On Saturdays, a priest was available to hear Confessions, give spiritual advice, and the ministry of healing. During Choir School term times, Choral Evensong was offered regularly during the week, Festal Evensong on the eves of feasts, and a solemn eucharist on feast days. Mo. Lee-Pae began a service of Contemplative Prayer on Fridays in the Resurrection Chapel. Sunday worship continued and on Advent Sunday, an early said Mass (Rite 1) was re-introduced at the slightly earlier time of 7:45 a.m. so that adequate time was left for the preparations for the 9 a.m. Sung Mass. The 9 a.m. Mass continued to grow in number as did the Noble Singers. The youth acolyte guild also grew and children and young people regularly participated in readings and leading the Prayers of the People. On the second Sunday of the month a Sung Eucharist in Korean Language was introduced.

An Epiphany Sequence of music and readings was held on Sunday, January 16 and repeated on Tuesday, January 18.

In the Week of Christian Unity, we welcomed the Permanent Observer to the Holy See, Archbishop Gabriele Caccia, to

preach at a special Evensong on Sunday, January 23.

Choral Mattins and Eucharist was held on January 30 and October 30.

Since exposition and benediction had been well received last year, Evensong and Benediction was held on Sunday, February 6.

On Sunday, February 20, Bishop Andrew St. John celebrated the 50th anniversary of his priesting and presided at the 11 a.m. Mass. Dean McGowan from Berkeley Theological Seminary preached.

On Ash Wednesday, Ashes were re-introduced and made available at all services and in the church all day. Confession times were also expanded. During Lent, silent prayer before the Blessed Sacrament was held all afternoon with a special intention of praying for the end of the war in Ukraine. On Fridays, Come and sing Compline allowed the congregation to form the choir. The Way of the Cross and Mass was celebrated each Saturday in Lent; the stations acting as the Liturgy of the Word and the Prayers of the People, the service concluded appropriately in the Resurrection Chapel with the 'Fifteenth' Station – the Resurrection – and the offertory of the Mass.

A full observance of Holy Week was observed this year. We welcomed the Rt. Rev. and Rt. Hon John Sentamu, recently retired Archbishop of York, who preached on Palm Sunday, Holy Monday, Holy Tuesday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil, and Easter Day at 11 a.m.. His theme was "Living a Jesus Christ shaped life." The gentlemen sang the evening Masses on Holy Monday and Holy Tuesday, and the office of Tenebrae on Holy Wednesday. The full choir sang the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Maundy Thursday. The Three Hours' Devotion on Good Friday was preached by the Rev. Dr. Katherine Grieb who had led Holy Week in 2022 with the gentlemen of the Choir. The full choir resumed the singing of the Triduum and three services on Easter Day. In 2022, instead of a sermon at Evensong on Easter Day, a procession was held with carols and prayers offered at three stations: the Font, the Easter Garden, and the Shrine of our Lady of Fifth Avenue.

On Sunday, May 22, Bishop Dietsche made his first visit for some time to confirm and receive new members into the Episcopal Church. On the same evening, a special Evensong was held to honor all involved in the Funeral Industry.

A Valedictory Service was held on Trinity Sunday, June 12 at which the Head of School gave a charge to the Class of 2022 and awarded them their silver crosses.

On the Feast of Corpus Christi, Sunday, June 19, Solemn Evensong was followed by a Procession of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction. We believe that this is the first time this has happened in Saint Thomas.

The Summer Feast Days program continued following its success in 2021. Each Solemn Eucharist was followed by cheese and wine in the Narthex:

Wednesday, June 29 – St. Peter and St. Paul, Apostles

Friday, July 22 – St. Mary Magdalene

Monday, July 25 – St. James the Apostle

Wednesday, August 24 – St. Bartholomew the Apostle

A full observance of All Saints and All Souls was held with services on the actual days and on All Saints' Sunday and Remembrance Sunday. The Patriotic and Historical Societies of New York attended a special Evensong and act of remembrance on Sunday, November 13.

The full choir sang on Thanksgiving Day.

Advent Sunday was marked with the singing of the Litany in procession, and the Advent Procession was held on Sunday, November 27 at 4 p.m. and Tuesday, November 29 at 5:30 p.m. The shorter version of Lessons and Carols was held on Wednesday, December 14 followed by a lunch for seniors, and Tuesday, December 20 attended for the first time by Ambassadors, Consul Generals, and their staff and staff from the United Nations followed by a reception in Andrew Hall. A full service of Nine Lessons and Carols was held on Sunday, December 18 and on Christmas Eve at 4 p.m. The Blessing of the Crèche this year had music provided by the Noble Singers and the Grade 8 choristers. Midnight Mass was kept at the earlier time of 10:30 p.m. On Christmas Day, there was a said Mass at 9 a.m. in addition to the Solemn Eucharist at 11 a.m.

On Sunday, March 13, the Rector preached at St. John's Cathedral, Los Angeles.

The Rector preached Trinity Church, Wall Street, New York on Saturday, May 7, 2022 at 11 a.m. on the occasion of the 25th Anniversary of the Life Profession of the Rev. Sr. Marie Promise Atelon SSM.

On Sunday, June 5, the Rector preached in the Chapel Royal, St. James's palace for a special Evensong to commemorate the Platinum Jubilee of HM Queen Elizabeth II.

On Sunday, October 9, the Rector preached at St. James' Cathedral, Chicago as part of a Trebles' Festival attended by our own choristers.

Bible Study Group

The class resumed at 1:30 pm on Friday, January 14. This meeting was the last session with Fr. Bennett before his departure to Edinburgh. Starting January 21, Fr. Mark Brown led the study group. From May, Fr. Schultz led the group for the rest of the year.

We often read in Holy Scripture about holy ground—Moses at the Burning Bush, told to remove his shoes because the ground on which he stands is holy, provides the archetypal example of encounter with holy ground. And it is encounter that is important to what makes holy ground holy. What every story of holy ground richly demonstrates is that the ground is revealed to be holy because that's where encounter with God occurs.

This is precisely what pastoral care is about: seeking encounter with God in home and hospital and discovering in the pastoral relationship; in prayer; in counsel; in burdens, pain or doubts shared; in Eucharist given and received, that we stand on holy ground—that, indeed, the holiest conceivable ground is the ground of the human heart where the Eternal Word of God is joyfully born anew in any human soul willing to conceive him.

While the Word is joyfully born in us, it is not always the case that the Word is always sought in the midst of joy. Sometimes there are birth pangs. Sometimes the circumstances under which we are being brought to the joy God desires for us are difficult or even dire. But always, God desires to be born in us.

While visits to the homebound and hospitalized in 2022 increased as the pandemic continued to wane (our number of visits was well above the average of the visits made in the previous three years, bested only by the number of visits made in 2019), the frequency of Baptisms and Weddings have returned to pre-pandemic levels. As one might expect in the third year of a pandemic that has claimed the lives of so many, the number of funerals is higher than in 2019, though at 50% higher, it is likely the case that many of our departed loved ones have yet to receive the funeral rites that the corporal works of mercy urge us to celebrate. From all of this, a couple things are clear, particularly given the lower number of confessions made compared to pre-pandemic years. The first is this: people remain reluctant to receive a visit and Holy Communion from a priest, remain reluctant to make their confession, reluctant to be physically present to each other. This may be due to residual Covid fears, or a general reluctance to disclose one's pain or predicament, even to a sympathetic priest. My hope is that this reluctance, regardless of reason, will gradually fade.

The second insight is this: pastoral care still remains, in the thinking of most, something that's needed only in crisis. And while, yes, it's true, we're there in times of crisis, progress in faith, prayer, and the ongoing discipline of giving birth to the Eternal Word: these things do not end when crisis recedes. We do not cease to be called to holy ground. We are always being called to fall more deeply in love with Jesus. My desire for the ministry of pastoral care at Saint Thomas is that more people, in whatever circumstance they may find themselves, will avail themselves of the ministry, so that, more and more, together, in and as community, we may find the holy ground we seek.

YOUNG ADULTS

After a brief leadership hiatus at the start of 2022 and meetings with both outgoing and incoming leaders, Saint Thomas' ministry to Young Adults came roaring back with a new seasonal outreach brochure outlining plans for fellowship, spiritual growth, and renewal in the 2022-23 program year.

A robust November kickoff event hosted at the Rectory by the Rector and Mother Turner brought Bishop Shin and young folks from around the diocese to share in the celebration of the revived group. A monthly Sunday brunch gathering quickly created a sense of community, togetherness, and friendship amongst the members of the group, many of whom were new to Saint Thomas and planning for Baptism, Confirmation, or Reception in the New Year.

CHILDREN AND FAMILY MINISTRY

From January – June, Mother Turner and Ms. Floyd, with the assistance of Miranda Perkins (a longtime volunteer), prepared our weekly gathering for Sunday School after the 9 a.m. Mass. Mrs. Kellerman-Filsell continued to bring an enriching musical component to this weekly time for our 3–12 year-olds and Mrs. Morfi continued to support children and families in their involvement with Parish and Manhattan-wide ecumenical Outreach Opportunities, such as a special collection for Ukraine, the Angel Tree, and Easter Basket projects. As the summer term ended, we bade farewell to the Perkins family as they emigrated to the UK after many years of commitment to Saint Thomas.

In September 2022, Sunday School resumed and our Family Feasts returned as enjoyable opportunities for breakfast and fellowship for all ages. During this term we started to see more families at church in light of the changes in vaccination availability for younger children. Ms. Tricia Powell and Ms. Fiona Tian worked as part of the Children and Family Ministries team in both the Nursery and Sunday School. Families also joined together for some of our all-age activities, such as our annual Central Park Picnic and Palm Cross making, Christmas Card making for the homebound, as well as Advent Wreath Making. Members of staff and parishioners supported both our feasts and weekly lessons throughout the term. This included a visit from Saint Francis, Saint Nicholas, and Pamela Lewis, who gave her annual Advent presentation to the children and continued to prepare and encourage our Youth Lectors and younger readers for various services.

A Children and Families e-newsletter to parents and supporters continued to be mailed out each week detailing a wide range of gatherings throughout the year.

Since the introduction of the 9 a.m. Mass, in September 2021, and the development of a choir for local children age 5–12 called the Noble Singers, more children and families became involved in our worship. The choir continued to be directed by Choir Director and Cantor, Mrs. Rebecca Kellerman-Filsell (Music Associate for Children and Youth), with children participating in one of two weekly rehearsals and a Sunday rehearsal at 8 a.m. supported by Mother Turner, Mr. Adach, and Ms. Tian. In addition to supporting the 9 a.m. liturgy each Sunday morning in term time, twelve Noble Singers Choristers received their RSCM white ribbons on Laetare Sunday, while many participated in Choir Camp, a new September serving as both a musical introduction for new comers and a new term reunion for singers. Some of our singers also led a Stations of the Cross service for families on Good Friday, and all participated in leading the Annual Crèche service with Grade 8 students from the school. This was followed by a Children and Families Festive party in the Parish House.

PAN-ASIAN MINISTRY – “Belonging & Empowering”

Pan-Asian Ministry aims to give Asians a sense of belonging to the Church and to provide pastoral care appropriate to their special status as minorities and marginalized people, especially in the situation of hate crimes against Asians that have become more severe after the COVID-19 pandemic.

There are various challenges in running this gathering, such as generational differences due to wide age range from 20s to 70s, cultural differences as many are from different countries – Malaysia, China, Korea, Hong Kong, Japan, Taiwan, etc. and difference in mindset depending on the length of time lived in the United States. Providing a safe place to share their life stories and grow together in faith is a meaningful ministry regardless of its scale.

Mo. Lee-Pae started Contemplative Prayer every Friday with Taizé chants, Centering Prayer, and Lectio-Divina, geared toward Asians but open to all. A monthly Pan-Asian fellowship program was introduced that was also occasionally opened to non-Asians. It was the beginning stage of Pan-Asian Ministry, so gatherings were more focused on building fellowship, but programs have gradually turned toward spiritual growth. Some of the programs that were offered last year are listed below:

There were ministerial collaborations with EAST (Episcopal Asian Supper Table) and EDNY (Episcopal Diocese of New York), notably a Welcome Reception for Deacon Acella Lee, Director of the I Am Spring Center for child victims of domestic violence and sexual abuse in Daejeon, South Korea, hosted by Saint Thomas Church at the rectory on Oct. 15, 2022. Mo. Lee-Pae has been working with and supporting the fellowship of EAST with Saint Thomas Church as its recognized base for ministry.

OUTREACH

The Ecumenical Outreach Partnership between Saint Patrick’s Cathedral, Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church and Saint Thomas Church, known as the EOP - continued its ministry to our homeless neighbors and those in need in 2022. Most requests for services came in the form of basic needs (food, clothing, and toiletries), however, clients also had access to more in-depth services, including counseling with a social worker and assistance with housing, legal and health concerns.

2022 brought one major change to EOP – Omicron! This Impacted several EOP staff and resulted in a reduced capacity operation for the first three weeks of January. Once the full team reassembled in the end of January the program thrived. EOP provided lunch twice a week, as well as spiritual care. Clients were successfully placed in the following housing facilities, Safe Horizon, Oliveri, Breaking Ground and Queen of Peace. Clients self-disclose demographic data during the intake process. Most of the clients served were over 50 years of age and homeless.

MUSIC NOTES

The **47th Annual Conference for Choirmasters and Organists** was held from May 1 – 3 with organist and pedagogue Todd Wilson, Head of the Organ Department at The Cleveland Institute of Music, and Director of Music at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Cleveland, Ohio, as guest clinician. The conference celebrated the music and legacy of Saint Thomas Church's former Organist and Master of the Choristers Gerre Hancock in the conference's opening recital and keynote lecture. Other presenters included Dr. Jeremy Filsell, The Reverend Canon Carl F. Turner, Nicolas Haigh, and Christopher Seeley. Thirty-three organists and choirmasters from around the country attended the conference.

The **Saint Thomas Girl Chorister Course** was held from **July 23 – 31**. The 2022 STGCC featured Katherine Dienes-Williams, Organist and Master of the Choristers at Guildford Cathedral, as Guest Director of Music, as well as Janet Yieh as Guest Organist, and Jacqueline Horner-Kwiatek as guest voice teacher. Jeremy Filsell and Nicolas Haigh served as course organists. Twenty-nine choristers from around the country attended the course and sang 5 choral services at the church during their week in residence.

The boy choristers travelled to sing concerts in the **Midwest from October 5-10**. In Madison WI, they performed concerts in Luther Memorial Church, and in Chicago IL, in St. James' Cathedral. In Chicago, they featured in a Treble Festival at St. James Cathedral which included 40 choristers from the Chicago area. The tour was the first in two years due to pandemic restrictions.

In February **Jeremy Filsell** (organ) and the **Saint Thomas Choir of Men and Boys** released the album **J. S. Bach: Clavier-Übung III** on Signum Records. On this recording, the choir sang the Lutheran chorales which precede Bach's organ settings and paraphrases. Jeremy Filsell recorded the organ works on all five organs of the church. In April, **Jeremy Filsell** released an album on the Raven label, of organ works composed by Michel Boulnois (1907-2008). Filsell played the 2018 Dobson Organ at Saint Thomas Church, New York on this, the first solo recording of the organ.

INSTITUTIONAL ADVANCEMENT

Development

The Office of Institutional Advancement was comprised of the fundraising team of Bruce Smith, Chief Advancement Officer, Adam MacDonald, Director of Development, Amy Cheresnowski, Database Manager, and Wee Tai Hom, Development Associate, as well as the Communications team of Blake Martin, Director of Communications and Production, Avery Griffin, Communications Manager and Audio Engineer, and Dalton Cheatham, Communications Associate, who began in June 2022. Ben Koch moved on from Saint Thomas to pursue his dream of working in sports media after Easter. Michael Stark started in November 2022 as Administrative Assistant, also working in that capacity with Fr. Moretz. Together, this team is charged with telling the story of Saint Thomas Church and Choir School to increase engagement, broaden access to our ministries of liturgy, music, theology, and education, and to raise funds for the support of our mission. The OIA team accomplishes these goals through direct outreach to our community of donors, including one-on-one meetings, social gatherings, and excellence in the livestream presentations of our worship services and concerts.

Annual Appeal Chair Eric Blair-Joannou and Co-Chair Darren Littlejohn led the 2023 campaign, supported by Adam

MacDonald. The Committee met at the House of the Redeemer for an in-person stewardship retreat facilitated by Fr. Schultz. Bruce Smith helped to coordinate plans for the Saint Thomas Bicentennial, working closely with Bicentennial Committee Chair Kazie Metzger Harvey. Plans including a bicentennial exhibition, a gala, educational opportunities, and a tour of the Choir to the UK in 2024. Mr. Smith and Mr. MacDonald began a feasibility study for a potential capital campaign. Feasibility study interviews continued into 2023 and the report will be made to the vestry in that year. Amy Cheresnowski continued to lead the full implementation of the TouchPoint Database system. She helped clergy and lay staff make full use of the software event and class registration, volunteer information, as well as for contributions and vestry elections. One notable improvement is that all Saint Thomas donors have access to their donor records and are able to download their annual statements at any time. Many donors took advantage of the opportunity to check their progress toward the pledge completion or for tax purposes. Wee Tai Hom cleaned up hundreds of addresses and alumni records.

Spearheaded by Mr. MacDonald, Saint Thomas continued to explore rental opportunities. Death of Classical, a non-profit music organization, rented the Nave in March for the U.S. premiere of Infinity Gradient by Tristan Perich, with the Miller-Scott organ played by James McVinnie. Over 700 of people attended the concert, many of who had never been inside Saint Thomas before.

Friends of Music

While maintaining enthusiastic participation from core supporters, the Friends of Music felt the ripple effects of the last few years of pandemic and current economic climate, and there was a decline in contributed revenue in 2022. Several key supporters died or relocated away from New York, some had a change in financial circumstances, and still others found their philanthropic interest drawn to other organizations. Most significantly, since 2017 the Russell Keys Oberlin Foundation had provided substantial annual support to Saint Thomas for Friends of Music. In 2022 the Foundation ceased operations. We are grateful for the decision of the trustees to distribute the entire sum of the fund to Saint Thomas in accordance with Mr. Oberlin's great love of the Choir of Men and Boys. Of note, in November 2022, Ronald Thomas, a long-time parishioner and supporter of Friends of Music, commissioned a new work for the Saint Thomas by Choir School alumnus Trevor Weston '81. American Lamentation addresses the entanglement of slavery, racial inequality and the Episcopal Church in New York.

SAFEGUARDING

Mother Turner led a parish Safeguarding Monitoring Committee, which met on a monthly basis and reported to the Vestry. Commissioned by the Vestry, the collaborative committee included:

Christopher Seeley (Head of School), Aaron Koch (Executive Assistant to the Head and School Safeguarding Administrator), Miriam Allman (School Nurse), Claire Thomas (School Nurse), Nicolas Haigh (Assistant Organist) on behalf of the Choir and Music Department, Aaron Koch (Head Verger until August), David Bryan (Head Verger beginning October and online administrator for safeguarding), Sharlene Shah (HR Manager), Christopher Haley (Clerk

to the Vestry and Vice Chair of the Choir School Board of Trustees) and The Rev. Alison Turner on behalf of Children and Families and the Clergy. Their work continued to monitor current safeguarding protocols and practices, in both the school and church. New training by the Episcopal Church was rolled out across the organization, with the support of the Office of Institutional Advancement and HR, in order to develop our collective familiarity with safeguarding policies which also promote aspects of inclusion, hospitality and welcome.

As part of an external Audit, The Vestry took on board recommendations from an external audit of our policies from T&M USA LLC regarding our next set of priorities for action planning, which include preparing a Staff, Volunteers, and Student Handbook.

At the end of October, there was a joint meeting of the Choir School Board of Trustees and the Vestry of the Church with the author of the safeguarding investigation report, our legal team from Ropes and Gray, our counsel from Sullivan and Cromwell, our Director of Communications, and a specialist PR team from Camino PR. We heard a precis of the T&M investigation into historic allegations of sexual misconduct, and received advice from the legal team and the communications team. We were able to ask questions, and we voted to publish the report in full, accompanied by a community letter signed by the Head of School, the Board Chair, and the Rector. This happened within 24 hours. Within hours of publication, the first response came and was from a former chorister. It was short and sweet:

“A remarkably powerful and well-writte2 letter.
Thank you,

NAME
St. Thomas Choir School, Class of 58”

The responses that came in after were all in the same vein. Thanks was the sentiment that pervaded all of them. We had said that we wanted to do the right thing for the right reason; we had taken time to reflect and to find appropriate advice and support. We ensured that we were prepared for the day of release. We held two meetings in advance – one for church staff, then another for school staff and faculty; the Rector wrote to all staff and faculty and ensured that pastoral care was available, including the availability of clergy off site; we reached out to the former wardens, Headmaster, and Rector Emeritus to advise them that the report was about to be released. Fr. Mead and Fr. Wallace kindly wrote back expressing gratitude. On the day of the release, Bruce Smith (CAO) and the Rector met and reached out to a number of significant donors who had given sums to the Choir School; The Rector also reached out to those who were about to become new Vestry members. Again, the response was overwhelmingly positive, including a long phone call with a major donor. All the reporting letters were written and Fed Expressed to law enforcement, child protective services, and in one case, to the school where one of the alleged perpetrators is now working. That school has subsequently been in touch with us and with T&M.

The investigation email and phone line remained open. T&M were contacted by one member of the Alumni Association that confirmed some of what has been reported in the final report.

STAFF CHANGES IN 2022

A loving parent of two Choir School Alumni (Zach Cobb, '01 and Andrew Cobb, '03), she will be working closely with the Head of School, Christopher Seeley, to pursue the mission and to grow the community of Saint Thomas Choir School.

After serving with distinction as Assistant Verger from 2015–18, and then as Head Verger from 2018–2022, Aaron

Koch has made arrangements with Head of School, Chris Seeley, to become the Choir School Executive Assistant for Administration. He agreed to assist the Vergers' Office during a transitional period that began Monday, March 21.

We welcomed Maks Adach, our new Associate for Musical Studies and Assistant Organist. His most recent position was at St. Paul's Choir School in Boston, a Roman Catholic day school. A LETTER FROM THE INVESTMENT COMMITTEE

J.P. Morgan continues to advise and manage our investment portfolio as our outsourced investment managers, while working closely with the Investment Committee of the Vestry who oversees their work.

In 2022, we focused on implementing strategic improvements to our investment portfolio and financial operations. We actively worked to reduce the overall cost of operating our endowment, refine our asset allocation strategy, and streamline our financial reporting systems. These efforts afford us greater flexibility to invest across various asset classes as new opportunities presented themselves throughout the year. Additionally, our Investment Committee took a proactive role in assisting the Vestry around sustainable spending discussions, recognizing the importance of preserving our resources before we deplete our unrestricted investment pools beyond recovery.

Despite the challenges faced by all investment classes in 2022, marked by the impact of rising inflation on economic growth, corporate profits, and consumers' purchasing power, our portfolio demonstrated resilience. While we did not entirely shield ourselves from these headwinds, our investments showed relatively lower volatility and outperformed the market while also coming in line with our policy benchmark. As of December 31, 2022, our portfolio had a total return of approximately -14%, compared to the S&P 500 Index, which was down approximately -18%. The total value of our invested funds reached \$130 million by the end of 2022.

It's crucial to emphasize that we primarily rely on withdrawals from our invested funds to cover the operating and capital expenses of the Church and Choir School. On average, we derive 80% of the funds allocated to ministry, music, and education from withdrawals to our endowment, while the remaining 20% comes from various sources throughout the year, including the annual appeal, one-time gifts, and bequests. Consequently, we undertake any changes with great care, adhering to conservative principles – especially given the unsustainably high withdrawal rates. In 2022, our portfolio saw total withdrawals to satisfy expenses of \$11.6 million, with \$8.2 million supporting the Church and Choir School's operating budget and \$3.4 million allocated to the capital budget.

At year-end 2022, we maintained a balanced and diversified portfolio that was allocated 55%, 25%, 20%, to public equities, alternative investments, fixed income and cash, respectively. During the year, we added to our equity investments as markets decreased and began to open new positions in higher yielding fixed income assets.

Lastly, the investment committee would like to encourage those who haven't already done so to consider joining the Noble or Duffie Guilds. By including arrangements in your estate plans that benefit Saint Thomas Church and Choir School, you actively contribute to securing our institution's future.

TREASURER'S REPORT

2022 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

A Letter from the Treasurer

A full copy of the financial statements of Saint Thomas Church as audited by its independent public accountants, PKF O'Connor Davies, is available on our website.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP). During the year ended December 31, 2022, Saint Thomas Church spent \$12 million in direct program services, which included \$5.9 million in support of ministry activities, \$1.9 million in support of our music program, a \$1.0 million Diocesan assessment, and \$2.6 million in direct support of the Choir School. We maintained our support to organizations that share our core values, grants and awards provided during the year were \$418K. The level of expenditure for direct program activities increased by \$2 million. Program growth was experienced in ministry, music, and Choir School educational programs.

Additionally, we spent in supporting services a total of \$4.1 million. Supporting services increased by \$600K when compared to the prior year. Supporting service activities for the Church were \$2.2 million and \$1.9 million for the Choir School. The increase of \$600K is primarily attributable to the Choir School, during 2022 new strategic positions were added to facilitate student recruitment.

Funding for these activities are through the generous and faithful giving of Saint Thomas' congregation. Contributions totaled \$4.3 million, which included the annual appeal campaign of \$1.4 million. During 2022, we received bequests from faithful pledgers totaling \$1.9 million. Included in this amount is the final distribution of the Merow Estate of \$1.1 million. In addition to these bequests, Saint Thomas received a gift from the Russell Oberlin Foundation of \$1,130,000 as its final distribution. The Foundation was a substantial annual supporter of the Music program.

Revenue from Concerts at Saint Thomas has not yet returned to pre-pandemic levels. Ticket revenues during 2022 were \$164K. Activities continued to be supported by donors to the Friends of Music at Saint Thomas, amounts raised in 2022, were \$188K.

Our investment assets continue to substantially fund our operations. Fair market values, including the beneficial interest in perpetual trust, reported on December 31, 2022, were \$130 million. A conservative spending rate, as approved by the Vestry, is applied to determine the amount spent in support of the Church and Choir School operations.

We are looking forward to our Bicentennial celebration in 2023. Saint Thomas Church will continue to focus on its strategic objective as we deliver our mission to worship, love, and serve Our Lord Jesus Christ through the Anglican tradition and our unique choral heritage.

In 2023, Saint Thomas retained most of the gains achieved in the 2022 Annual Appeal, despite the economic uncertainty and inflation that impacted charitable giving nationwide. Giving USA reported a 3.4% decline in overall philanthropy in 2022. Despite that trend, Saint Thomas support held firm in number of donors and saw a modest 2% decline in pledges for 2023. We would like to thank the Annual Appeal Chair Eric Blair-Joannou, Co-Chair Darren Littlejohn and the committee for their active support.

2022 COMPREHENSIVE PHILANTHROPIC SUPPORT

Comprehensive Philanthropic Support

Philanthropic support for Saint Thomas comes in the form of pledges to the annual appeal and of gifts for everything from Choir School scholarships to community service, the music programs, the Girls Chorister course, and Easter baskets and backpacks for the children of St. Ann’s Church in the Bronx. Measured in cash received*, total philanthropic support for Saint Thomas in 2022 was \$6,137,766. Bequests and gifts to endowments represented 64% of overall giving. Pledge payment income to the Church on the Choir School was \$1,368,878, representing 23% of overall giving in 2022.

These additional gifts come from pledging parishioners as well as tourists, visitors, the online community, foundations, corporate matching programs, and, most significantly, members of the Saint Thomas planned giving societies, the Duffie and Noble Guilds (listed on page xx). Saint Thomas received substantial gifts for its endowment (list begins on page 56) that will help to ensure its long-term financial sustainability.

PLANNED GIFTS

Many of the most significant gifts in the history of Saint Thomas Church and Choir School have been estate gifts. There are many ways to do this, and a few of these are described below. The Rector and the Vestry encourage members of the Parish to remember Saint Thomas in their estate plans.

BEQUESTS

All adults should have a will and decide upon the legacy they leave for the people and institutions they love – if you do not define your estate provisions, state law will do so. If you would like to make a provision in your will to leave a specific sum to the Church, the language of the bequest to Saint Thomas Church should read:

“I give to Saint Thomas Church in the City and County of New York, for its corporate purposes, the sum of _____ dollars.”

If you decide to leave a percentage of your estate, your will could include the following language:

“I give to Saint Thomas Church in the City and County of New York, for its corporate purposes, _____ percent of the rest, residue and remainder of my estate.”

The form of bequest to Saint Thomas Choir School would read:

“I give to Saint Thomas Church in the City and County of New York, for the support of the Saint Thomas Church Choir School, the sum of _____ dollars” or “ _____ percent of the rest, residue and remainder of my estate.”

These forms of bequest may be changed in consultation with the Rector and the Head of School to reflect the intentions of the donor. For example, a donor may wish to create a choristership, which is an endowment gift of at least \$500,000.

LIFE INSURANCE

It is also possible to support Saint Thomas through gifts of life insurance by:

Naming the Church or School as the beneficiary, in whole or in part, of an existing policy or as a contingent beneficiary, or

Cashing in a policy and donating all or part of the cash value to Saint Thomas.

OTHER WAYS TO GIVE

It is also possible to make significant gifts to Saint Thomas through Charitable Remainder Trusts, Charitable Lead Trusts and retirement plans, such as 401(k)s and IRAs.

COLUMBARIUM

When finalizing these important end-of-life decisions, please consider the Columbarium in the Resurrection Chapel. The Columbarium consists of five hand-carved oak cabinets, each with one hundred private niches for the permanent storage of remains.

It is important to talk with your family and your financial advisor before making a decision about including a gift to Saint Thomas in your will. Saint Thomas cannot render any legal or tax advice.
